ROCKFORD - "Curvy Girls of Northern Illinois Have Your Back."


This slogan rang true on the flip side as group supporters came out in droves at the first ever "Rock The Curve" for Scoliosis.

Gracing the shirt was embroidered with the Curvy Girls logo. Additionally each girl signed thank you card for Mr. Gammel's generosity.

I wanted to talk to other girls going through the same things, feeling alone or different, angry about having to wear a brace, and worried about having surgery. With my mom's help eventually Curvy Girls of Long Island was formed. During meetings Curvy Girls discuss teen related issues, how to wear clothing tips, and share stories.

Leah Stotlz touched hearts with her words.


